

Tom Talk

A few weeks back we had what I believe was our 26th and know was our largest awards banquet for Bozzuto Management Company employees. On the theory that there is no such thing as a free lunch, the folks gathered for this event had to listen to some thoughts from me before they could get their awards, let alone have anything to eat or drink.

Because what I said applies as much to people who work in other divisions and support operations as it does to the people in BMC, I am having my comments reprinted here. I would hope everyone in the company, including those of you who were at the BMAs, would take a moment to read this, not because it is so wonderfully eloquent, but because it will remind you of why we do what we do and what it is we stand for. Thank you.

Thank you Julie. Thank you all! Welcome everyone. It's wonderful to see you here tonight. Congratulations to each of you whose achievements are being recognized this evening.

Please know, however, that in my book, every single one of you here tonight is a winner. And so, to each of you, I say congratulations and thank you. Thank you very much!

Let me ask you to recognize one individual here tonight. This person needs no introduction, so let me simply ask you to acknowledge your extraordinary leader, my partner and my friend, Julie Smith.

Let me also ask you to recognize the other leaders of the company: co-founder and COO Rick Mostyn, company President and future CEO Toby Bozzuto, and all the partners: Tom Baum, Mike Schlegel, Steve Strazzella and Dan Murphy. Please join me in acknowledging their extraordinary leadership.

Every year, I'm asked to address the issue of whether as we grow, we run the risk of losing sight of who we are. Can we change and still be the same? Are we still what we started out to be 28 years ago?

And we certainly have changed and grown. Bozzuto Management Company had its most successful year ever, growing our portfolio of properties under management from 170 to more than 200, our total units to more than 50,000; and our retail space to more than 1.5 million square feet, and on top of that, we have moved into Chicago and Atlanta.

And every other part of The Bozzuto Group has grown, as well: the construction company has completed more work than ever in its history; the development company delivered more than 2,000 units last year and has expanded its operations into Boston; and Bozzuto Homes is successfully selling properties throughout its portfolio, including, sight unseen, more than fifty percent of the new condos it's building here in DC.

And one other thing is new this year: for the first time in 40 years, my wife and I are renting a Bozzuto apartment! I am paying a LOT of money to live in Cathedral Commons!

So please extend your pity to the poor manager, Juliana Thomas, who has to put up with the renter from hell. And I'm not talking

about my wife.

So. ves. we have changed a lot.

But we all understand that though change may be uncomfortable, you can't get better; you can't be the best you can be, without constantly changing.

Without change, we wouldn't benefit from new people, new ideas, new programs, and new designs— and we are most certainly benefitting from these

Think about how we as individuals change each year —we get a little older; hopefully, we get a little smarter; maybe our family is a little larger; and unfortunately, maybe we weigh a little bit more.

But we are still the same person

And that's the way it is with The Bozzuto Group. For despite all these changes and despite our tremendous growth, we haven't changed who we are or what we value most.

Our Core Values of Concern, Creativity, Passion and Perfection, guided us when we started the company 27 years ago, and they continue to guide us today.

Concern means caring; it means paying close attention to the people you're talking with, it means listening; basically, it means treating each other, our customers, everyone we deal with, the way we expect to be treated.

Creativity means bringing new ideas, bringing your brain to work every day, it means helping people solve their problems. It means being open to new ideas.

When we talk about **Passion**, let's think back on that film we just saw. Passion means doing what you love, and if you don't love your job, if you don't love what you do every day, do yourself a favor and find something else to do because, day in and day out, what we do is extremely important.

My ask of you tonight, and I do have an ask, is that we all continue to push ourselves and our colleagues to let our corporate values guide us in everything we do.

We must remain focused on taking care of our customers, taking care of our clients, and taking care of each other as colleagues.

And together we will accomplish great things. This is the Bozzuto way.


Bozzuto Homes Opens New Design Center
